The Philp Prize, presented in 1955 by Dr & Mrs. L. D. Philp, will be awarded to the helm coming second in the Championship.

The Twiname Prize, presented in 1955 by Mr & Mrs. A. Twiname, will be awarded to the helm coming third in the Championship.

The Hatrick Prize, presented in 1957 by Mr & Mrs. D. D. L. Hatrick will be awarded to the helm with the highest position in the Championship who has not won a prize in a club event (excluding open meetings) during the current or past 4 seasons. Prize shall mean a prize awarded for any single race or series, excluding the Beginner's Prize.

The Beginner's Prize, presented by the Club, will be awarded to the helm with the highest position in the Championship who satisfies the following conditions:

(a) He must not have become a Club member earlier than the previous year.

(b) He must not have won a prize in a Club event during the current or previous year

The Grant Cup, presented in 1963 by Mr & Mrs G. R Grant, will be awarded to the helm under the age of 18 on the 1st August having the highest position in the Championship.

Tinker Trophy presented in 1990 by the Tinker Class Association. A 5 race series sailed as per MJM trophy, except that all classes will be eligible to enter.

The Starters Prize presented by Mrs. Doreen Douglas in memory of Robin. A 2 race series as per MJM trophy, except that all classes will be eligible to enter, both races to count.

Mark Ninnim Memorial presented by Phil Hodgkins in memory of Mark. A 2 race series as per MJM trophy, except that all classes will be eligible to enter, both races to count.

The Herb Telford Starters Prize presented in 2019 by Mrs A Telford and family in memory of Herb. To be awarded to the highest place youth helm in the Starters Prize, a youth being under 19 on the day of the race. If there are no youth helms entered, then it is to be awarded to the highest place youth crew.

Celebrity Glass Trophy presented in 1991 by Celebrity Glass. A 2 race series of pursuit races.

The Paul Carruthers Memorial Trophy presented in 2001 by Mrs. Florence Carruthers in memory of Paul. A 2 race series sailed as per MJM trophy, except that all classes will be eligible to enter, both races to count.

NIGHT JAR

AUTUMN & WINTER SERIES

The autumn series is split into a separate Saturday & Sunday series, and takes place in October. The winter series takes place in November, racing only on Sundays. These races will be for all classes, and all classes will start together. Results will be calculated on Fleet Handicap, and trophies awarded accordingly. The Winter Trophy, presented by Mr. & Mrs. P. Carruthers in 1982, will be awarded to the winner of the Winter Series.

ELIGIBILITY FOR RACES

1. **Club Championships** (GP, Mirror/Tera/Slow Handicap, Handicap and FF), **Long Series and others** (all classes). Positions in the Club Championships Long Series and other series/races will be accredited to individual helms in whichever boat they choose to sail, provided that they are members. Positions in Championship Weekend Series will be accredited to an individual helm sailing a specific class and configuration. A helm changing class of boats (eg.RS200 to Laser) and/or configurations (e.g., Standard/Radial Laser) will receive separate results for each class/configuration sailed in that weekend series.
2. Helms are reminded that all boats racing must comply with their own class rules and have a valid class measurement certificate. Boats must be sailed in a configuration recognised by the appropriate Class association and for which a valid PY handicap is available. The latter will be subject to inspection by the Sailing Committee on request. In class racing, Mirrors sailed single-handed will be permitted and can compete on equal terms with crewed boats. In handicap racing the appropriate handicap for the configuration sailed will apply.
3. A race shall not be constituted unless there are at least 2 starters (complying with section 2). Single boats from adopted Club fleets may join in the handicap fleet if they would otherwise be the only starter in a separate race for their class.
4. Permanent changes of boat must be notified to the Membership Secretary
